

**WELCOME NEWCOMERS!**

If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes in the Church, few parishes have any kind of dress code. Here, however, we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church services:

- **Women and girls** must cover their heads. Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan in the vestibule. They should also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting; slacks, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low cut clothing are not permitted.
- **Men and boys** should wear a suit coat and tie
- Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at Church services.
- Also, unless you have been attending the Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with Father.

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**SAINT AGNES, VIRGIN & MARTYR**

**January 21 – Patroness of Children of Mary**

In the persecution which Emperor Diocletian evoked in 303, St. Agnes died. Saints Augustine and Ambrose tell us that she was only 13 years of age. The noblemen of Rome vied with one another to obtain her hand in marriage, but she refused them all, saying that she had chosen a Spouse who could not be seen with mortal eyes. Her suitors accused her of being a Christian. The threats of the judge had no effect upon her. They sent her to a house of "ill repute", but the sight of her inspired such awe that not one of the wicked youths of the city dare approach her. One, bolder than the others, was suddenly struck with blindness and he fell trembling.

The youthful saint came forth from this den of infamy uncontaminated in mind and body, and still a pure spouse of Christ. The most prominent among her suitors was now so enraged that he incited the judge still more against her. The heroic virgin was condemned to be beheaded. "She went to the place of execution," says St. Ambrose, "more cheerfully than others go to their wedding." Amid the tears of the spectators the instrument of death fell, and her sinless soul took its flight to the Immortal Spouse whom she had loved better than her life. She was buried on the Via Nomentana, a short distance from Rome, and Constantine erected a church on the spot in her honor. Lives of the Saints, pgs. 41 & 43.
