If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes in the Church, few parishes have any kind of dress code. Here, however, we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church services:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan in the vestibule. They should also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting; slacks, shorts, sleeveless, tight, or low-cut clothing are not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a suit coat and tie.
- Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at Church services.
- Also, unless you have been attending the Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with Father.

VISITATION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN

This feast, celebrated on July 2nd, commemorates the visit of the Blessed Virgin to her cousin, St. Elizabeth, in the mountains about six miles west of Jerusalem. "Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb," exclaimed the mother of St. John the Baptist, and Mary responded in the words of the Magnificat: "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior."

The Annunciation and the Incarnation took place, according to tradition, about the time of the vernal equinox; and the Blessed Virgin left Nazareth for a village now called Ain-Karim, formerly known as "St. John in the Mountains," at the beginning of April. Some churches formerly celebrated the feast of the Visitation at that time; but as the end of March and the beginning of April often came in Holy Week, Pope Urban XI and Pope Boniface IV, in the 14th century, assigned the feast to July 2nd, the day after the octave of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist, and about the time when Mary left the home of Zachary and Elizabeth to return to Nazareth.
