If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes in the Church, few parishes have any kind of dress code. Here, however, we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church services:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan in the vestibule. They should also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting; slacks, shorts, sleeveless, tight, or low-cut clothing are not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a suit coat and tie.
- Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at Church services.
- Also, unless you have been attending the Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with Father.

Words of Our Lady to the Children on July 13th, 1917

"You have seen Hell," she explained to them, "where the souls of sinners go. To save them God wishes to establish in the world the devotion to my Immaculate Heart. If people do as I shall ask, many souls will be converted and there will be peace. This war is going to end, but if people do not cease offending God, not much time will elapse and during the Pontificate of Pius XI another and more terrible war will begin. When you shall see a night illumined by an unknown light, know that this is the great sign from God that the chastisement of the world for its many transgressions is at hand through war, famine, persecution of the Church and of the Holy Father.

"To prevent this, I shall come to ask for the consecration of Russia to my Immaculate Heart and the Communion of reparation on the First Saturdays. If my requests are heard, Russia will be converted and there will be peace. If not, she will spread her errors throughout the entire world, provoking wars and persecution of the Church. The good will suffer martyrdom; the Holy Father will suffer much; different nations will be annihilated. But in the end my Immaculate Heart will triumph. The Holy Father will consecrate Russia to me, and it will be converted, and some time of peace will be granted to humanity. $\underline{\mathbf{A}}$

Eight Signs of a Religious Vocation Absolutely Necessary Conditions

- **1. Good health:** As religious life makes great demands upon one's physical condition, good health is necessary.
- **2. Ordinary talents:** Excepting a vocation as a lay sister, religious sisters must teach others, and therefore be capable of advancing in learning themselves.
- **3. Reasonable independence:** If one is obliged to care for one's parents, for instance, one is not free to enter the religious state.
- **4. Normal piety:** If one is not at least ordinarily devoted to religious practices, it can hardly be expected that she would be fitted for the more than ordinary exercises of a religious state.

Signs of Vocation Which are Inspired by God in Free Will

- **1. A spirit of sacrifice:** An ability to give up lesser but more appealing goods for greater, but more visible ones.
- **2. A spirit of zeal:** That special form of charity that inspires one to think of doing something to save souls
- **3. A spirit of detachment:** The power that enables a person to be in the world and not of the world, to control the emotions, and if necessary, suppress them. Some sign of this power is necessary for a vocation to the celibate state.
- **4. A desire to be a religious**—or at least a conviction that to enter the religious state is the surest way for one to save her soul.
