

**WELCOME NEWCOMERS!**

If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes in the Church, few parishes have any kind of dress code. Here, however, we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church services:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan in the vestibule. They should also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting; slacks, shorts, sleeveless, tight, or low-cut clothing are not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a suit coat and tie.
- Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at Church services.
- Also, unless you have been attending the Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with Father.

We are always happy to see new faces at Mary Immaculate Queen Church and we look forward to seeing you again.

**St. Robert Bellarmine, Bishop**

**Confessor and Doctor of the Church – May 13**

St. Robert Bellarmine was the third of ten children. His mother...was dedicated to almsgiving, prayer, meditation, fasting and mortification of the body...One day little Robert was kneeling in church with his mother. He was attracted by a mural depicting a saint dressed in a cardinal’s robes and whispered to his mother, “Look, mother, I have become a cardinal!” His mother tried to keep the young boy quiet but he then pointed to another mural depicting the four principal Doctors of the Church, and added prophetically, “Do you see those four Doctors? Some day I too will be numbered as one of them.” This prophecy, like so many others of St. Bellarmine, after three centuries, was finally verified. He joined the Society of Jesus and was later made Cardinal and Archbishop of Capua. He was famous throughout Europe as a theologian and a defender of the Faith. **ST. PASCHAL BAYLON, Confessor**  
**May 17- Patron of Eucharistic Congresses**

Born at Torre Hermosa in the Kingdom of Aragon, in the year 1540, St. Paschal Baylon spent his early childhood as a shepherd. So great was his desire for instruction that while tending his sheep he carried a book with him and begged those he met to teach him the alphabet. Thus, in a short time he learned to read. He led the solitary life of a shepherd until he was about twenty-four. By meditation, prayer and the reading of pious works, he advanced rapidly in perfection, so that when he decided to embrace the religious state and petitioned the Franciscans to admit him into their Order, he had already reached an eminent degree of sanctity. When he decided to become a Religious, he purposely avoided rich monasteries, for he said, “I was born poor, and I am resolved to die in poverty and penance.”

In 1564 he entered among the Reformed Franciscans in the Kingdom of Valentia and insisted upon becoming simply a lay brother. For twenty-eight years he lived a perfect life in the austere Order he had chosen, a life of extreme poverty and of constant prayer, which even his labors did not interrupt. The saint was characterized by intense devotion to Our Lord in the Holy Eucharist. Toward the end of his life, he frequently spent a great part of the night in prayer before the altar. God often favored him with ecstasies and raptures, but so great was his humility that he carefully avoided whatever might redound to his honor or praise. St. Paschal also had a singular devotion toward the Blessed Virgin. He died on May 17, 1592. Lives of the Saints, pages 192-193
