If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes in the Church, few parishes have any kind of dress code. Here, however, we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church services:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan in the vestibule. They should also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting; slacks, shorts, sleeveless, tight, or low-cut clothing are not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a suit coat and tie.
- Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at Church services.
- Also, unless you have been attending the Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with Father.

SAINT MARIA GORETTI, Virgin & Martyr July 9—Patroness of Youth

St. Maria Goretti is one of the youngest saints of the Roman Catholic Church. She died a martyr to preserve, and seal with her blood, her love of Jesus and her loyalty to God's commandment.

St. Maria Goretti was beatified by Pope Pius XII on April 27, 1947. Among the crowd that thronged St. Peter's Basilica on that memorable day were Maria's mother, brother and two sisters. In his address to the pilgrims, who had come for the ceremony, largely Catholic Action groups of girls, the Holy Father congratulated the mother for the "incomparable happiness of having seen her daughter elevated to the honors of the altar." Maria, he added is the mature fruit of a Christian home with its old simple method of education, "of a home where one prays, where the children are brought up on the fear of God, in obedience to their parents, in the love of truth and self-respect; accustomed to be satisfied with little and to give a helping hand." Comparing Maria with St. Agnes, the Pope remarked that "the delicate grace of these adolescent girls might make us overlook their courage; yet strength is the virtue of virgins and martyrs." Our Lady of Fatima – July 13th Apparition

Here, thought Lucy, was the opportunity to set all her doubts at rest. "Dear Lady, will you please tell us who you are? Will you work a miracle so that all the people will know that you really do appear to us?"

"Continue to come every month," the Lady replied. "In October I will tell you who I am and will work a miracle so great that all will believe in the reality of the apparitions."

Even as she said these words, the Lady once again opened her hands and the rays of light that shone from them ... The children looked—but the earth was no longer there. They were gazing into a ...ocean of fire. "Even the earth itself seemed to vanish, and we saw huge numbers of devils and lost souls in a vast and fiery ocean. The devils resembled black animals, hideous and unknown, each filling the air with despairing shrieks. The lost souls were in their human bodies and seemed brown in color, tumbling about constantly in the flames and screaming with terror. All were on fire, writhing and without their bodies, and neither devils nor damned souls seemed able to control their movements. They were tossing about like coals in a fiery furnace, with never an instant's peace or freedom from pain."... "You have seen Hell," she explained to them, "where the souls of sinners go. To save them God wishes to establish in the world the devotion to my Immaculate Heart. If people do as I shall ask, many souls will be converted and there will be peace. This war is going to end, but if people do not cease offending God, not much time will elapse and during the Pontificate of Pius XI another and more terrible war will begin. When you shall see a night illumined by an unknown light, know that this is the great sign from God that the chastisement of the world for its many transgressions is at hand through war, famine, persecution of the Church and of the Holy Father.


