

**WELCOME NEWCOMERS!**

If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes in the Church, few parishes have any kind of dress code. Here, however, we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church services:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan in the vestibule. They should also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting; slacks, shorts, sleeveless, tight, or low-cut clothing are not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a suit coat and tie.
- Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at Church services.
- Also, unless you have been attending the Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with Father.

Raccolta #557**

**ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY**

**August 15**

On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII defined as a truth revealed by God that the Immaculate Mother of God, Mary ever Virgin, when the course of her life on earth was finished, was taken up body and soul into heaven. Such is the dogma of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin.

“It was surely fitting, it was becoming, that she should be taken up into heaven and not lie in the grave till Christ’s second coming, who had passed a life of sanctity and of miracles such as hers...Who can conceive that God should so repay the debt, which He considered to owe to His Mother for the elements of His human Body, as to allow the flesh and blood from which it was taken to molder in the grave? Or, who can conceive that that virginal frame which never sinned, was to undergo the death of a sinner?...She died, then, because even Our Lord and Savior died. But though she died as well as others, she died not as others die; for, through the merits of her Son, by whom she was what she was, by the grace of Christ, which in her had anticipated sin, which had filled her with light, which had purified her flesh from all defilement, she had been saved from disease and malady, and all that weakens and decays the bodily frame.” (Cardinal Newman)

Jesus and Mary both passed through the gate of death into heaven. In her own way, Mary was crucified with Jesus. She patiently stayed on earth, after His Ascension, so long as God willed.

From her place in heaven, she still abides invisibly with us, ever our refuge, our comfort, our hope. Through the Communion of Saints, of which she is the Queen, we share in the joy and glory of her Assumption to which the Introit of the Mass of August 15<sup>th</sup> gives us the key.

**HOLYDAY OF OBLIGATION:** This Thursday is the feast of the Assumption of Our Blessed Mother and is a holyday of obligation. Mass attendance is obligatory, and all unnecessary servile work is forbidden. Please make note of the special Mass schedule for Thursday.

**FEAST OF ST. PHILOMENA:** Today is the feast of St. Philomena, who is referred to as “Saint Philomena, the Wonderworker.” The members of our Congregation have always professed a special love and devotion to this wonderful saint; moreover, the first Mass in our church was offered on this day in 1969! Devotions in

her honor will be prayed after each Mass today, and there will be the blessing of St. Philomena cords after the first Mass.

**SUNDAY DRESS:** Remember the importance of dressing well for Mass, especially on Sundays. Men should wear a dress shirt and tie (suitcoat may be dispensed in summer, due to the heat). Women should wear a dress or skirt that covers the knees fully, whether standing or sitting, with a blouse that is not form-fitting, providing full coverage in front and back, reaching at least to the elbows on the arms. How we dress in church indicates our reverence for God in His house.
