WELCOME NEWCOMERS!

If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes in the Church, few parishes have any kind of dress code. Here, however, we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church services:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan in the vestibule. They should also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting; slacks, shorts, sleeveless, tight, or low-cut clothing are not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a suit coat and tie.
- Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at Church services.
- Also, unless you have been attending the Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with Father.

SAINT CASIMIR, Confessor

March 4—Patron of Poland

St. Casimir was the third among thirteen children of Casimir IV, King of Poland. He was born on Oct. 5, 1458. Although educated in the royal court, he had a horror of luxury and practiced many mortifications in secret. Under the care of the holy canon, John Dugloss, he grew up in singular innocence. One of his principal devotions was to the Blessed Virgin, in whose honor he composed, or at least frequently recited, the well known "Hymn of St. Casimir."

preserved untainted his purity of soul and body, nor could he ever be induced to enter the state of matrimony. A lingering tuberculosis ended his brief career, which was brought to a close at Vilna, the capital of Lithuania, in 1482, at twenty-four years of age.

CHURCH FAST LAWS

- 1. Everyone over 21 and under 59 years of age is bound to observe the law of fast.
- 2. The days of fast are the weekdays of Lent, including Holy Saturday, the Ember Days and Vigils of Pentecost, the Immaculate Conception and Christmas.
- 3. On days of fast, only one full meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals. sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs; but together they should not equal another full meal.
- Meat may be taken at the principal meal on a day of fast except on Fridays, Ash Wednesday, Holy Saturday, and the Vigils of the Immaculate Conception and Christmas.
- Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices, are allowed.
- To the end of his life St. Casimir 6. Where health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. In doubt concerning fast or abstinence, a parish priest or confessor should be consulted.

*There is no obligation for fast or abstinence on a holy day of obligation, even if it falls on a Friday.
